7.11.1 VALIDITY. Fatigue damage in the form of cracks which reduce the load-bearing cross section gives rise to a nonlinear (elastic) compliance which superimposes on the intrinsic nonlinear elastic behavior. In this article, the theoretical principles for the assessment of fatigue damage (and crack propagation), based on the measurement of nonlinear compliance effects and on complementary data obtained from parallel replica studies of surface cracks, will be outlined.

Weep holes are drilled through risers in wet-wing structures in order to permit remanent fuel to be evenly distributed during flight.
