In 2018, American Indian or Alaska Native children have the highest rate of victimization (15.2 per 1,000 children) and African American children have the second-highest rate (14 per 1,000 children). Children whose parents are unemployed have about two times the rate of child abuse and two to three times the rate of neglect than children with employed parents.

State law defines child abuse as (1) physical injury inflicted on a child by another person, (2) sexual abuse, or (3) emotional abuse. Child neglect is defined as negligent treatment which threatens the child's health or welfare. The different types of child abuse/neglect can be categorized as follows:
