In women who present with acute uterine bleeding associated with uterine fibroids, conservative management with estrogens, selective progesterone receptor modulators, antifibrinolytics, Foley catheter tamponade, and/or operative hysteroscopic intervention may be considered, but hysterectomy may become necessary in some cases.

Uterine fibroids are noncancerous growths of the uterus that often appear during childbearing years. Also called leiomyomas (lie-o-my-O-muhs) or myomas, uterine fibroids aren't associated with an increased risk of uterine cancer and almost never develop into cancer.

ABSTRACT: Uterine leiomyomas (also called fibroids) are the most common solid pelvic tumors in women and the leading indication for hysterectomy. Although many women with uterine leiomyomas are asymptomatic and can be monitored without treatment, some will require more active measures.

Alternatives to Hysterectomy in the Management of ...

Options: The areas of clinical practice considered in formulating this guideline are assessment, medical treatments, conservative treatments of myolysis, selective artery occlusion, and surgical alternatives including myomectomy and hysterectomy. The risk-to-benefit ratio must be examined individually by the woman and her health-care provider.

The management of uterine leiomyomas

Anti-progesterone effect - reduces action and number of progesterone receptors in fibroids and myometrium. Improved symptoms in 60-75%, may induce amenorrhea, reduction in fibroid volume 25-50% within 3 months. Side effects include hot flashes, elevated hepatic enzymes, and endometrial hyperplasia.

How To Manage Uterine Fibroids (leiomyomas or myomas)

180 postmenopausal patients with uterine leiomyoma were examined. To correct menopausal manifestations, patients were prescribed: Group 1 (n = 60) - low-dose drug estradiol 1 mg/drospirenone 2 mg, Group 2 (n = 60) - ultra-low-dose drug estradiol 0.5 mg/drospirenone 0.25 mg, Group 3 (n = 60) - patients refused to take menopausal hormone ...
