So it seems that as good as the original Royal Tiger was, Leyland was wise to undertake the early rework. The elements of the Tiger Cub design set the pattern for the UK bus industry, being followed by AEC with its 1953 Reliance. (Although I think that AEC would claim that the Reliance design was chosen before the Tiger Cub was released.)
