Responding is a natural part of the reading process. When students read a piece of literature they respond to it by using their prior knowledge to construct meaning. That is, their transaction with the text results in the construction of their own personal meaning (Rosenblatt 1938/1976; 1991).

Elementary students enjoy responding to literature in small discussion groups. Literature response activities require elementary grade students to go beyond summarizing their reading selections. In a literature response, students must connect to the story, through their empathy toward characters or insight into the cause and effect of plot events.
